Bengal, Kushan style coinage of the c.2nd - 3rd century A.D., gold dinar 7.21 grams, imitating Kanishka I, obv, king standing to left holding trident and sprinkling incense over altar, rev. goddess Ardoxsho standing right, tamgha to right, (cf. Mitchiner, Bangladesh p.30 No.23 var.). *Very fine although weakly struck and very rare.*

This dinar is a crude copy struck by the local kings of Bengal in imitation of the coinage of the Kushan King Kanishka I. The striking of these was due to the growth of the trade routes with the Kushan lands in the north. By the fourth century A.D. these imitative types were replaced by Gupta coinage.

Samudragupta, (c.A.D. 330-370), gold stater, (7.648 grams), standard type, obv. king standing to left, wearing Kushan style coat and trousers, holding a tall standard with his left hand, sacrificing over altar, in the field to left is the garudadhvaja, the Garuda-topped standard, Samudra in Brahmi letters to his immediate right, poetical legend around, rev. goddess Lakshmi seated facing on a two leg stool, holding a cornucopiae and a noose, symbol to left, to right the biruda of the king, the Brahmi legend 'Parakramah', (Altekar cf. plate I, 14, BMC 6 [Pl.I, 6] from very similar dies, cf.M.4774). *Offine style, very fine and very scarce.*

This is the first type coin struck by the Guptas, and clearly derived its inspiration from the Kushan type of Kanishka II and successors. The tridents are transformed into a plain standard and the Garuda-standard. Ardoksho enthroned becomes Lakshmi enthroned, whose adjuncts, the noose and cornucopiae identify her image. The engraver in most Gupta coins always gave the obverse his greatest attention with his skill, for both its composition and style, but the reverse was less important and generally of poorer style.

This is the only Islamic gold coin struck by any of the successor states to the Bahmani kingdom of Kulbarga. It was struck to the pagoda standard of the Karnataka. Ismail had five examples having an average weight of 3.37 grams. The legends read "The World has gained ornament and glory from these two Muhammads, One Muhammad the Prophet; two Muhammad the Shah". This coin type was briefly described in 1912 by Taylor and more adequately by Ismail in 1925. Subsequently the Spink-Taisei example was illustrated, other examples have turned up in the last few years.

They swept down in a magnificent charge and the Turks fled. The 93rd under Sir Colin in person, being formed in two ranks, opened independent fire from the right of sections, and the Russians broke and fled when within 200 yards of the 'Thin Red Line tipped with steel'. Two privates of the 93rd only were wounded. Though few Russians were killed, nearly every horse and man were wounded The 93rd 2nd Bn is the only Infantry Regiment in the British Army granted the distinction of bearing the word 'Balaklava' on its colours. 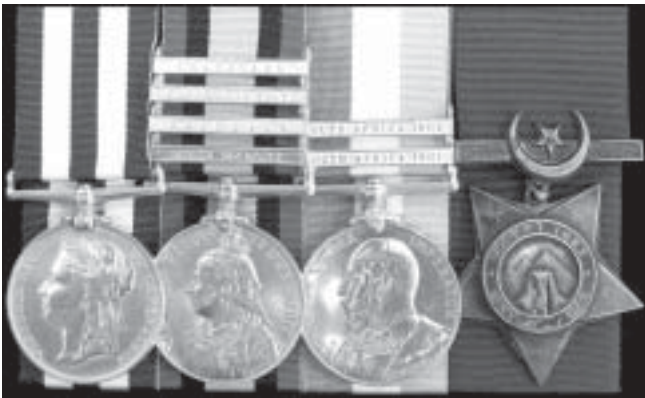

In 1886 the Canadian Voyageurs - three hundred and seventy seven Canadian civilian boatmen and their seven officers and eight 'wheelsmen' were each awarded the Egypt Medal and the Khedive's Star for their services during a Lord Wolseley's expedition to relieve General Gordon at Khartoum. Wolseley's plan called for the transport of part of his force by boat up the Nile River and, based upon his service in the 1870 Red River Expedition in Canada, he felt that Canadian boatmen has the necessary knowledge and experience to navigate successfully the treacherous cataracts of the Nile. Consequently, advertisements were placed in Canadian newspapers in August 1884 for 'good boatmen . to accompany English Expedition up the Nile to steer boats through the rapids and do all necessary portaging'. The response came from Indians and white men alike, most of whom were normally engaged as raftsmen in the lumber trade in eastern Ontario, Quebec and Manitoba. They reported in Ottawa on 6 September 1884, received outfits and free rations and sailed from Quebec on 16 September under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel Frederick C.Denison. Although they remained civilians, the Voyageurs were subject to the authority of their foremen and of the officers of the Canadian Militia who accompanied them.

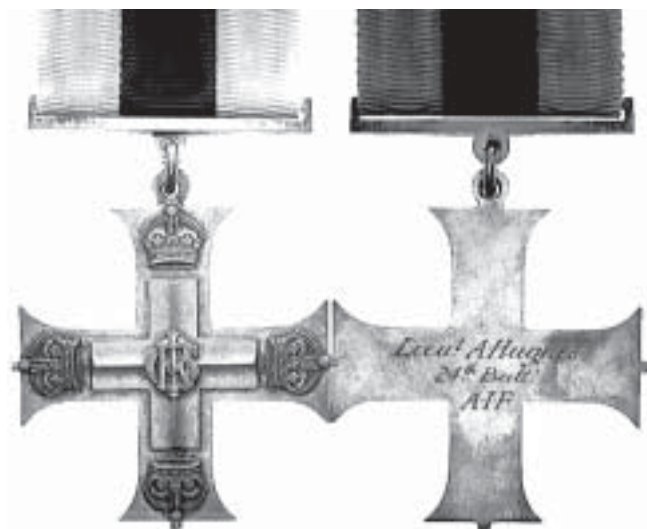

He was appointed I.S.O. in 1903 and retired in 1905. The Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria was an appropriate time to recognise the men and officers of the force with this unique medal.

In September 1942 more than 15,000 Australian and British troops were packed into the Selarang Barracks, Changhi faced with death by execution, starvation and disease. For nearly a week the troops had refused to sign an illegal order from the Japanese captors under which they would not attempt to escape. One of the duties of all soldiers is to return to their units. As a result of the speech from the Australian troops Commander, Lieutenant-Colonel Frederick Galleghan the men signed the document. His finishing sentence "All you have to do at present is to play the game like men, be soldiers of the A.I.F., carry out your orders of the A.I.F. and with the help of God, I hope to lead you home again successfully", was met with cheers from the men. An important and rare document from W.W.II.
