A COLLECTION OF ROMAN & ROMAN PROVINCIAL COINS

This collection was formed by an avid coin collector from Hungary from the 1930s to the 1950s. A meticulous record of the coins was made by the original owner with rubbings and photos in three large volumes compiled in the Hungarian language.

The collection was sold to a partnership in 1987-8 and the present cataloguer was commissioned to catalogue the majority of the Roman coins and some of the Greek Provincial coins except those from Egypt. The commission was completed with a photo and description made of every coin which filled 15 large album volumes. The sheet describing each coin will be available to any purchaser of that coin after the completion of the sale. In addition the present cataloguer was asked to add additional Roman Republican coins to the collection and those coins have their pedigree added to the catalogue description.

The catalogue following is arranged differently to the normal Noble Numismatics pattern, and will follow that description provided on the numbered coin illustrated sheets with the serial number being added to the end of the lot description in italics.

The collection was catalogued using Sear's 4th revised edition of Roman Coins and their values published in 1988. The Greek Imperial coins mainly from Alexandria in Egypt have references to Dattari (D) and have, wherever possible, additional references including the collection of the Ashmolean Museum by J.G.Milne and the collection of the University of Koln catalogues by Angelo Geissen.

A specimen is reported and described, as noted above by W.H. Waddington, of a coin with a diameter of 29 mms. but is not illustrated. On the evidence of this reference, Banti and Simonetti (Corpvs Nvmmorvm Romanorvm) publish the issue. It is a great rarity and is noted in the Tafel (plate) of the original owners catalogue as the reverse being of Britannicus. The evidence appears to be contrary to this attribution.



He fought with his brother against Caesar at Munda and escaped with his life. After Caesar's death he managed to become master of the Mediterranean Sea and seized Sicily. Comments on the second coin as follows; Sextus Nonius, possibly the moneyer's father, in 81 B.C., inaugurated the 'Ludi Victoriae Sullanae' in honour of Sulla's victory at the Colline gate. The first coin notes that the Marcia gens claimed descent from Ancus Marcius, the fourth king of Rome, who is said to have been the first to bring water to Rome by means of an aqueduct. The equestrian statue is that of Q.Marcius Rex, who when Praetor in 144 B.C., was commissioned by the Senate to repair the old aqueducts and to build one which would give a supply of water to the Capitol. This aqueduct is known as the AQUA MARCIA.

As the people resented their loss, Plautius caused them to be placed in wagons and conveyed back to Rome early in the morning and in order that they should not be recognised their faces were covered with masks. 
