Anna Perenna was a sister of Dido and was worshipped in Italy as a rustic deity and it may be that this gens claimed descent from her. C. Annius was sent against Q. Sertorius in Spain some time after the middle of 82 B.C. The early part of the issue was struck in Italy in the name of L. Fabius but the issue continued to be struck in Spain under C. Tarquitius.

L. Aemilius Lepidus Paullus was Consul in 50 B.C. and was an ardent supporter of Cicero. He claims a spurious descent from an L. Aemilius Paullus, and the reverse indicates that this L. Aemilius Paullus was on three occasions hailed Imperator, a questioned tradition possibily fictitious. The presence of king Perseus and his two sons draws attention to the last and greatest victory of the three, that of Pydna in 168 B.C. Concordia head on the obverse reflects the 'concordia ordinum' (harmony & order), which was central to Cicero's policy in 63 B.C.

As consul for the year 88 BC, L.Sulla was awarded the coveted assignment of suppressing the revolt of Mithradates VI of Pontus, but political manoeuvers resulted in this assignment being transferred to the rival party of C.Marius. In response, Sulla turned his army on Rome, captured it, and reclaimed his command against Mithradates. His prosecution of the first Mithridatic War was successful, but he spared the Pontic king for personal gain. In 83 BC, Sulla returned to Italy as an outlaw, but he was able to win the support of many of the leading Romans. Within a year he fought his way to Rome, where he was elected dictator. It was during this campaign to Rome that this denarius was struck. The obverse type represents Sulla's claim to be acting in Rome's best interests. The reverse shows Sulla enjoying the highest honor to which a Roman could aspire, the celebration of a triumph at Rome. (Text acknowledgement to CNG).

It also relates to the successful expeditions against the Vaccaei and Lusitani and the levying of troops for this campaign.

Comments on the second coin as follows; Sextus Nonius, possibly the moneyer's father, in 81 B.C., inaugurated the 'Ludi Victoriae Sullanae' in honour of Sulla's victory at the Colline gate. The abbreviated legend on the reverse records this first celebration. The use of Saturn on the obverse is uncertain. The last coin commemorates the worship of Juno Sospita which was introduced into Rome from Lanuvium, the birthplace of the Papia gens. She was the protecting genius of women, accompanying them through life from birth to death. The symbols on the obverse and reverse are related with some 235 pairs associated together. They are mostly symbolic of the various trade guilds.

Given an important naval command by Brutus, he turned to piracy following the downfall of the republican cause at Philippi. It was during this period that he issued coins in his own name. Later, he was reconciled to Antony but deserted him shortly before the battle of Actium.

In 2 B.C. Augustus received the title "Pater Patriae", an honour which particularly pleased him (Res Gestae, Divi Augusti 35). The reverse of this coin clearly represents Gaius and Lucius, his adopted sons, as heirs to the throne. They appear wearing the "toga virilis" and the spears and shields presented to them by the officers. The lituus and simpulum refer to the priesthoods (pontificate and augurate) which Augustus conferred upon them. This medal is copied from a genuine coin by Giovanni Cavino (The Paduan) an Italian medallist, contemporary with Benevenuto Cellini, who was born at Padua in 1499 or 1500. Little is known of his life and his medals were probably made at Padua where he resided until his death in 1570. He was aided by his son Vincenzo who probably continued to use his dies after his death. He is best known for his numerous imitations of Roman large-brass coins and medallions which are known as "Paduans". One hundred and twenty two of his dies are preserved at the Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris. However the great majority of the number of medals that survive today and called "Paduans" are cast from moulds from these original die struck medals. the cast medallic issues are relatively common.
