There were three people named T.Chambers who were sent to Australia as convicts. They are as follows, (1) Thomas Chambers arrived at Van Diemen's Land on board the Medina on 19 April 1825 (sentence Life); (2) Thomas Chambers arrived at New South Wales on board John on 22 May 1829 (sentence 14 years); (3) Thomas Chambers arrived at New South Wales on board John Barry on 7 September 1835 (sentence 7 years).

Convict token, created on a bronze cartwheel penny of 1797 shaved smooth on both sides, on the obverse is engraved, 'John/Tompson (incorrect spelling of Thompson)/aged 21/ Cast For/Death/1826', on the reverse is a crudely engraved coffin initialled at the end 'J.T.' and with a heart at the top, at the right side are crossed arrows, at the base is an arrow in a bow and at the left is either a cross or possibly a gallows. *Fine - very fine.*

John Thompson (alias Williams) was born in 1805. On 16 February 1826 he was sentenced at the Old Bailey for a burglary he had committed on the night of 16 January in Bethnal Green, London at the dwelling house rented by Thomas Curry, a broad silk weaver. He was accused of stealing 3 pillows (value 5s), 2 blankets (value 5s), I counterpane (value 2s) and 1 sheet (value 1s). The transcript of the court proceedings describes the fight that ensued when Mr Curry caught Mr Thompson in his house and involves statements given by key witnesses and police constables. Thompson did not have much to say during the proceedings with his closing statement being, I have nothing to say in my defence, nor have I any friends'. For this crime John Thompson was sentenced to death.

Fortunately for him, on 3 May 1826, Thompson's sentence was reduced to transportation for life. On 5 August 1826 he departed from England aboard the convict transportation ship 'Speke' (formerly the 'Warren Hastings') along with 155 other convicts. Amazingly, one of these was also named John Thompson who at the age of 16 had been sentenced on the same day at the Old Bailey. The 'Speke' with its cargo of convicts arrived at Port Jackson, Sydney, New South Wales on 26 November 1826.

After an unknown period of being indentured, Thompson was granted a Ticket of Leave which gave him some rights but he could not leave the colony. On 27 September 1841, under the name William Thompson, he was granted permission to marry a 19 year old woman named Sarah Weatherstone, also a convict. The wedding was conducted by Rev. H.H.Bobart at St John's Church of England, Parramatta, Greater Sydney. In 1842 they had one son whom they named Henry but little is known about him. John (alias William) Thompson died not long after in 1843 aged 37. Sarah later remarried Henry Laing. She had 5 more children and died at Liverpool, Greater Sydney in 1875 at the age of 53.

The Normal Institution was founded by Henry Carmichael in 1834. Carmichael was born in Scotland in 1796 and after graduating with a MA in theology in 1820 he moved to London and worked as a private tutor. In 1830 he was engaged by Rev Dr John Dunmore Lang to teach at his proposed Australian College in Sydney. They both sailed aboard the Stirling Castle and arrived in Sydney in October 1831.

Initially the set up of the new college suited Carmichael but by 1833 he was disenchanted, particularly with Lang's management style. They disagreed on the separation of religion from the syllabus in a public education system. Thus, when his contract expired in 1834, Carmichael left to form his own school. The new school was sited in Elizabeth Street opposite Hyde Park and opened in January 1835. It was a boys' school catering for both day students and boarders. When he left the Australian College Carmichael took 45 of his students with him and in the ensuing years he and Lang entered into a public slanging match that was widely reported in the press.

As well as teaching reading, writing and arithmetic the institute also taught modern and Oriental languages, portrait painting, drawing, dancing, gymnastics, fencing, military drill and it also included the study of religious knowledge but making students aware of the history of all religions. By 1838 Carmichael had lost much of his enthusiasm and handed the management of the school to his assistant, Henry Gordon. In 1849 the school relocated to King Street east under the direction of Rev Thomas Aitken after the original site was sold and it closed its doors in the mid-1850s.

Walter De Arrietta was the son of Spanish Count Jean Baptiste Lehimas De Arrietta who lost his estates during the Peninsula Wars and arrived in New South Wales in 1821. Walter Lehimas De Arrietta was born at Camden (Douglas Park) in 1830. His father had influential friends in government and was owed money by the crown for services rendered. He received a large land grant in excess of 2,000 acres at Camden, now Douglas Park. After Walter's father died in 1838 his mother re-married. Following this his older sister Louisa, born in 1828, attended a ladies boarding school so Walter probably attended the Normal Institution as a boarder. Later, Walter De Arrietta worked all his life as a printer at the Government Printing Office and was a member of the 1st Regiment NSW Volunteer Infantry. He died on 16 December 1901 at Belmore, Sydney, NSW.

## **Award for Water Rescue During Gippsland Floods**

RHS Case Nos.4908-4915 - Andrew John Bernard Sutherland, aged 54 years; David Carstairs, aged 51 years; Victor Keith Carstairs, aged 37 years; George Jemmeson, aged 58 years; George James Egan, aged 29 years, all of Lakes Entrance, Fishermen; William Richard Neal, Sale (Vic.), First Constable of Police, aged 35 years; Sidney Foote, Yarragon (Vic.), First Constable of Police, aged 37 years; and Keith William Pyle, Yallourn (Vic.), Constable of Police, aged 24 years, who risked their lives in flood waters during the Gippsland floods on December 1. The fishermen, accompanied by First Constable Neal, had to cross the Morwell River in a boat. The river was in flood, and the occupants of the boat narrowly escaped being overturned, owing to the rush of water and debris. On reaching Moe Constables Foote and Pyle joined the party, and with great hazard rescued a family after rowing through flood waters over trees, stumps and fences which were submerged. In some cases wire fences had to be cut. The flood was six miles wide, and there was a very strong current, which produced great risks, and the boat was in imminent and constant danger of being sunk

Each man was awarded a Bronze Medal.

This medal was awarded in Non-Agricultural, Section II - Apparatus and Application of the Liberal Arts, Class 572. Mr W.H.Paling had six exhibits in pianofortes, the two principal ones of which were the grand concert pianoforte, and an oblique pianoforte both in walnut wood, and of splendid workmanship.

William Henry Paling (1825-1895), was a musician, merchant and philanthropist born at Woerden, Netherlands, the son of John Paling, a pianoforte manufacturer. He was a trained music teacher. He arrived at Sydney in 1853 and shortly after established the W H Paling & Co music store. It relocated a few times but traded until the 1980s at 338 George Street, Sydney from premises acquired in 1891. He also had stores at other locations. He had many notable achievements which can be read in Australian Dictionary of Biography, Vol 5, (MUP), 1974.

Only twenty seven silver medals were awarded before the Victorian Humane Society became the Royal Humane Society of Australasia in 1883.

Lodge Athole No.752 S(cottish) C(onstitution) was located at Bundaberg, Queensland.

William Blaikie was born at Dalkeith, Scotland. He moved to Australia with his parents, arriving at Queensland in 1884. He then went to Bundaberg where he worked in a stationery business before opening his own business in about 1893. He traded as a stationer, tobacconist and newsagency in Bourbon Street, Bundaberg.

In addition to operating a business he was heavily involved in the music scene as he was a gifted musician and singer. In addition he was Treasurer of the Mutual Aid Lodge, M.U.I.O.O.F., on committees for the General Hospital, the School of Arts and the Race Club and Past Master of the Lodge Athole. He died on 12 June 1919 at the relatively young age of 50.

RHS Case No.2305/6 - Joseph Healy, aged 29 years, and Thomas Jeffree, aged 43 years, miners of Stawell, who attempted to rescue James Archibald Gilchrist, aged 9 years, at Stawell on April 27, 1906. The boy had been lost and it was suspected that he had fallen down an abandoned shaft, 800 feet deep, known as Scallan's. An attempt was made to reach the shaft from a drive, in the "Extended" mine, but this failed. Jeffree and Healy volunteered to go down the shaft on a rope. Jeffree went first, and was lowered to a depth of 400 feet. He was then drawn up, as the shaft was full of loose and projecting timber, and it was too dangerous. Then Healy went down to a depth of 500 feet, where the shaft was blocked, and he had to be hauled to the surface. The timbers were falling, and great risks were run, owing to the swaying of the rope. Subsequently both men joined in the search, which resulted in the boy's dead body being found.

Each man was awarded a Silver Medal.

With research including a newspaper account of the search and subsequent difficult task of finding and retrieving the dead boy's body.

RHS case 4879 - Harry Suggett, Norseman (W.A.), Trucker, aged 27 years, who rescued William George Shackel from the effects of an explosion on October 25, 1934, at the Norseman Gold Mine. Shackel was lighting 13 charges of dynamite in the face of a stope. He had lit seven when the first exploded. A miner named, Miotti saw what had happened and ran for help. Suggett ran along the drive, climbed above the timber and dragged Shackel down out of the stope to the drive and to safety. Suggett knew the other charges would explode at any moment, and they actually exploded as he went above the timber, throwing him back, but he persevered and rescued Shackel, who was seriously injured. Suggett was brought to the surface semi-concious. He had been hit by rocks and was badly shaken. He was admitted to hospital and was there for a week. In a special report Mr. A.W.Winzer, Inspector of Mines, says: "A more dangerous position for a man to get into would be difficult to imagine. In my opinion Suggett showed uncommon heroism and risked his life to save a comrade. Any person with a knowledge of explosives and facts of the occurrence must agree that Suggett is entitled to the highest award given for bravery.'

The man who was saved, W.G.Shackel, suffered the loss of a hand and other injuries.

They had handcuffed the escorts, and then jumped off the train at Royal Park. They were in the Royal Park Golf Course area, so my colleague and I searched for them, found them and gave chase. We managed to catch them after they had split up. When we arrived back where we had planned to meet, I had one prisoner and the other prisoner had my mate. They wanted to swap but we managed to get them both in the end. One of those times when all's well that ends well.'

Son: Kevin Cameron Jones, born 07Sep 1936 at Mt Gambier, Sth Aust, died 16Nov2004; served with Victoria Police 10May1957 to 30Jun1969 and 11Jun1971 to 15Feb1983; rank on discharge was Detective Senior Constable CIB Special Branch; Discharged as Medically Unfit. His Police Valour Award was presented to him at the passing-out parade held at the Police Training Academy on 3Nov1972.
