Holborn Restaurant at 218 High Holborn, Central London was opened as a restaurant in 1874. Previously it had been a casino, swimming bath and dance hall. It was expanded in 1883 and again in 1885 and then redecorated by T.E. Colcutt in 1896. Often visited by the Prince of Wales, it consisted of an Empire Grill, a large restaurant with facilities for dancing and a cabaret. It also had several private dining rooms, 14 smaller restaurants and three Masonic Temples.
