The standard anonymous Kahavanu have stereotyped figures of the king holding a sankh shell and lotus respectively on obverse and reverse. These variant types may have been struck at subsidiary mints around the island, or possibly even on the Indian mainland in Tamilnadu.

KANISHKA BUDDHA GOLD COIN RARITY

Buddha is also represented on staters and various copper issues of this ruler (Buddha is seated or standing). The series is discussed by Joe Cribb, 'Kanishka's Buddha image coins revisited' in 'Silk Road Art and Archaeology' but illustrates and describes the Paris Collection quarter stater example on p.166 and plate 1, (p.167).

Kanishka, a fervent Buddhist, is best remembered today for sponsoring the first great Buddhist conference at Kanish Vihar, that led to the adoption and promotion of Mahayana Buddhism, a school of thought that revered the life of Buddha as much as his spiritual teaching. The great bronze plaques that recorded the conference proceedings have never been found, but we are fortunate to have a report of the conference from the Chinese scholar Hien Tsang. The Buddha coinage was probably struck as a special issue in conjunction with the conference, and the image of Buddha would have made a stunning impact at the time. Buddha had previously only been represented in symbolic form, but under Kanishka the fusion of Greek and Indian culture led to the portrayal of Buddha in human form. Kanishka's coins were among these first representations and provide the earliest firmly datable images of the Buddha in any artistic medium. (source CNG)
