This was the first Australian Juvenile Industrial Exhibition held in Victoria and it was staged at Ballarat's (see note) Alfred Hall. It ran from 15 February to 1 June 1878. There were 205 silver and 172 bronze medals awarded as well as numerous certificates. In Class I Machinery, Engine Patterns Section, a bronze medal was awarded to No.27 William H.Batten, aged 19, of Vulcan Foundry, Geelong.

Note: The spelling of the name of Ballarat was regularly spelt as Ballaarat because it originated from two aboriginal words 'balla' and 'arat' meaning 'resting place' but over time this was shortened to Ballarat.

The second Mackay Agricultural Pastoral & Mining Association show was held at the end of October 1879 at the local racecourse and apart from the horse and sugar sections the number of entries was a bitter disappointment to the organisers. It was decided that no show would be held in 1880 and the next one in 1881 would be held on the Association's own ground which was in the course of being planned. In the 1879 show competition, Sugar Open Process - 2nd, a bronze medal for first place was won by A.Bell. He also won the Sugar Open Process - 3rd, bronze medal for first place.

Mr E.Parry was transferring to teaching duties in Timor. Although his pupils only received short notice of his leaving they determined to make a presentation to him. The presentation and an address of thanks were read by Master James Simpson, on behalf and in the presence of the scholars, in the schoolroom. It read:- Respected Sir, - We, the pupils attending the Public School at Moonan Brook, deeply regretting your removal from amongst us, cannot allow you to depart without some expression of our respect, and we humbly beg your acceptance of the accompanying small token of regard and esteem. Further we trust you will receive the same in the spirit in which it is now offered, and take the will for the deed. In now bidding you farewell, we would assure you that we will always remember you with gratitude, and, wishing you success in your new sphere of labour, we respectfully beg to subscribe ourselves, dear Mr. Parry, yours, most obediently, (and then a list of pupils present), on behalf of the 48 scholars attending the school.

Mr A.H.Rourke was a committee member of the Charters Towers Pastoral, Agricultural and Mining Association. He was also a racehorse owner and breeder and on the committee of the Townsville Turf Club (TTC). The awards were being put forward by him as a form of commemoration of the Coronation year. The prize ceremony was held at the Lithgow School of Arts on Friday 19 December 1902. The best boy, Ronald McNiven, chose to receive a gold medal suitably inscribed and called 'The Mayor's Medal'.

In response to a question regarding the closure of the Melbourne docks by the striking waterside workers the President of the above union, in a statement to the Sydney press in May 1919, said that its members would not go on strike but would stand behind the men who stood behind us. They believed in settling disputes by conciliation and arbitration. He further stated that if they met with hostile interference then they would not hesitate to stand together the same as they did in France (i.e. in war service). On 10 September 1920 the union had its name cancelled because it failed to lodge reports of its receipts and disbursements.

This Bronze Medal was awarded to John Danson in respect to his work during the Mount Mulligan Mine Disaster which occurred on 19 September 1921 and where every mine worker at the time was killed with a total of 74 bodies retrieved. The Royal Humane Society of Australasia requested details of instances of courageous acts by those attempting rescues with the intent to make Society awards to them. John Danson died on 26 September 1933 and is buried at the Mount Mulligan Cemetery in the Mareeba Shire of Queensland. The cemetery was established following the mine disaster.
