The Chi-rho symbol as appears on both standards held by Vetranio is an ancient Christian symbol. This symbol or christogram is made by overlaying the first two letters XP of the Greek word for Christ. It first appeared on a medallion made by Constantine I in 316 and was the symbol he saw at the battle of Milvian Bridge on 27 October 312 outside Rome against the usurper Maxentius. This symbol was placed on the standard and also on every shield by his soldiers. Several Christian emperors utilised this symbol on coins throughout the 4th century.

The Koson coinage was struck around 42 B.C., when Brutus, the exiled assassin of Julius Caesar, was raising troops in northern Greece in preparation for the final confrontation with Caesar's heirs Mark Antony and Octavian. Brutus had his own travelling mint, but this coinage was evidently a gift from an allied Dacian king from the lower Danube region. The king's name Koson appears on the coin and Brutus' name is reduced to a monogram which appears on some issues, including this example. Koson's coin type makes sense in terms of Roman propaganda. The eagle trampling a sceptre and the wreath symbolizes the anti-monarchical sentiments that prompted Caesar's assassination. The obverse type showing a Roman magistrate with his attendants, is copied from the coinage struck by Brutus himself in 54 B.C. It depicts an ancestor of Brutus who overthrew the Tarquin kings and founded the Roman Republic, serving as its first chief magistrate. This design thus serves to emphasize Brutus' attachment to the Republican traditions. A detailed thesis on the problems of fourees was produced in 2007 at Florida State University by Robert Conn IV "Prevalence and Profitability: The Counterfeit Coins of Archaic and Classical Greece".(available on Internet).

Electrum coinage also experienced counterfeiting from its inception and Ionian cities had laws established against such practices. An inscription from Mytilene, IG XII.2, typically dated to the early fourth century B.C.E., states that Phocaea and Mytilene will take turns striking electrum coins. The inscription are recorded and translated by J.M. Jones in his books. The counterfeiting of electrum coins commenced early in the issue of hektes, beginning in the late 6th to early 5th century B.C. and continued, but with a drop in production during parts of the last half of the fifth century; probably due to a shift in counterfeiting the more readily accepted Athenian coinage. The majority of plated pieces could have come from private sources or areas outside of administrative control as many of the plated pieces do not bear an exact resemblance to official dies. But Conn also notes however that even more telling is the traces of electrum plating left on the plated pieces are of the same percentages as the official mixture, this would indicate that the counterfeiters either had an intricate knowledge of the mixing process or someone connected with the mint and they were still involved in counterfeiting.

One of the rarer and earlier issues of Baktria, described by Bopearachchi as a unique commemorative coin (SNG ANS 9 page opposite plate 5). More coins were found in the late 20th century in a hoard. The type was struck in the name of Antiochos II but with the portrait depicting the physiognomy of Diodotos and his reverse type (Zeus striding to left) shows that it is Antiochos II who is commemorated and not Seleucos II and consequently provides the view that it was under Antiochos II that Baktria became an independent kingdom. This means that it was towards the middle of the third century B.C. (c.250 B.C.) that Diodotos, the satrap of Baktria and Sogdiana revolted against his Seleucid master and proclaimed himself king. Thus was born the Graeco-Baktrian kingdom.
