Medal of Bravery: Canada Gazette 20/6/1987 - awarded to Constable Jan Van Den Born of Maple Ridge, British Columbia on 15 June 1987; invested 25 September 1987.

Citation: On April 9, 1986, while on a routine patrol, Cst. Randy Marquardt observed a high-rise apartment building on fire in Coquitlam, British Columbia. Having requested back-up and alerted the fire department, he entered the building, climbed the stairs to the 12th floor and began knocking on doors to warn occupants and direct them to the stairwell. By this time, smoke was dense throughout the building. He proceeded downstairs, stopping on each floor to alert occupants. Unable to enter the 9th floor because of the heavy smoke, he was met on the 8th by Sgt. Andrews who assisted him in his task. On the 6th floor, they were joined by Cst. Reg Steward and, having obtained a master key, they went back to the 12th floor to ensure all occupants had left the building. Again they were unable to enter the 9th floor. Once outside Cst. Marquardt, who had been overcome by smoke inhalation, was helped to an ambulance. Cst. Steward and Sgt. Andrews assisting in crowd control, observed seven people still stranded on 9th floor balconies. Along with Cst. Jan Van Den Born, they re-entered, climbed to the 9th and located apartments where people remained. They had to force their way in and break the balcony windows to get to the frightened occupants. They then assisted them to the stairwell and downstairs where they were treated for smoke inhalation.

All four police officers were awarded the Medal of Bravery. They also received the Police Commissioner's Commendation.

Jan Van Den Born was born in Holland and immigrated to Canada in 1953. He first lived in Maple Ridge, British Columbia in 1961 and was a volunteer fireman from 1966 to 1974. After working as a postman and a municipal employee he joined the Royal Canadian Mounted Police at 26 years of age. Some of his postings were at Surrey, Williams Lake and Coquitlam.

Together with a folder of research including official letters for the award and the investiture of same as well as several letters from a variety of government officials and members of parliament, a copy of Pony Express August 1987, a RCMP GRC bi-lingual (English/French) journal featuring the details and the actions of the police officers in receiving the above awards, four other colour photos, three identical to the framed photo above, a copy of a letter written by J Van Den Born when he sold his medals and a sales listing for the above group dated 31/5/2006 for Canadian \$5,950.

He had 3 years service in the US Navy and 2 years service in the US Army. Enlisted in SH (Steinaecker's Horse) at Durban on 26 February 1901 - age 31, seaman, height 5'7", blue eyes, fair hair, tattoo on right forearm and 'X' on left arm, address: 28 Duke Street, Southampton (same as Trooper Hanrahan). NOK: mother, Mrs M.Hennessy, Liverpool, England. Slightly wounded (accidentally) at Nomahasha on 30 June 1901. Together with Trooper D.E.Wilson he was Mentioned in Lord Kitchener's despatches for rescuing a comrade (Trooper No.1110, Trooper G.Gaines) who was taken by a crocodile while bathing in the Usutu River at Usutu Poort in Swaziland on 30 November 1901. Trooper Gaines was dead when recovered. The citation read '...for most plucky rescue of the body of a comrade which had been carried off by a crocodile.' Discharged time expired at PMB (Pietermaritzburg) on 20 September 1902 after the cessation of hostilities. Qualified for the QSA medal with clasps Transvaal, SA 1901 & SA 1902.' (this medal illustrated at Fig 82, p209 of above book)

His energetic application of job knowledge played a significant role in contributing to the effectiveness and success of the United States Air Force mission. The distinctive accomplishments of Sergeant Rutan reflect credit upon himself and the United States Air Force.

Master Sergeant Robert J. 'Bob' Rutan, served 1960-1980; 71-73 Thailand; 73-74 Lang School in DC; 74-77 6916th; 77-80 6990th (see note) First Sgt; also served in Omaha and in Greece with 6916th Security Squadron in Athens; Died 1987; the Rutan family had a military service history as 'Bob' Rutan's father, Robert Rutan retired as a Navy Yeoman Senior Chief Petty Officer, one of his sons was Robert Rutan III who retired as a Coast Guard Machinist Chief Petty Officer, another son was Russell Rutan who retired as an Air Force Major, and yet another son was Ronald James Rutan whose last known posting was as Commander at the Navy Yard in Washington DC.

Note: 6990th Security Squadron directly supported RC-135 Combat Apple operations in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War and also supported C-130 operations at Cam Ranh Bay Air Base, Vietnam and Korat Royal Air Base, Thailand.

'Capt. Carmichael's Return to Recruit Another Thousand. Captain Carmichael, M.C., M.L.A., who was formerly Minister for Public Instruction in New South Wales, and who recruited a thousand men for the A.I.F., prior to going to the front himself, is returning to Australia, having been twice severely wounded. He stated, at Vancouver, en route to Sydney, that he intended to recruit another thousand men in New South Wales.'

It was later reported in the Crookwell Gazette, NSW, on Tuesday 26 March 1918, page 2 as follows.

'Captain Carmichael, M.L.A., whose career at the front has made him famous, has not lost faith in the courage or patriotism of his fellow Australians and Labor men. He is making a mighty effort to induce leading anti conscriptionists to take part in a convention, entirely apart from politics, with the view of stimulating voluntary enlistment.Mr. Tudor, the leader of the Commonwealth Opposition, Archbishop Mannix and other "No-Conscription" celebrities, with the view of enlisting their co-operation. He believes that a thousand recruits can he raised by united effort within the month, and he proposes personally to lead them to Europe. What is needed he declares, is to create an "atmosphere" favourable to recruiting. The warmest wishes for his success will attend his patriotic activities.'

The hilt of this sword has the Royal Engineer's 1857 pattern with attractive scrolling acanthus leaves on the guard. In 1892 the blade was changed to the new straight thrust design with the 1857 hilt initially retained but by the year 1900 the Royal Engineers were regulated to carry the same hilt pattern that the infantry had already adopted.

According to the family, this sword was issued to Arthur James Arnot and has been in the one family since it was issued. Arthur James Arnot was born at Hamilton, Scotland on 26 August 1865. He was an electrical engineer and arrived in Melbourne, Victoria in 1889 to erect a large alternating current plant for the Union Electric Co. He patented the world's first electric drill on 20 August 1889. He installed a comprehensive system of street lighting in Melbourne between 1891 and 1892 as well as managing the Spencer Street power station from 1894 to 1901. He held many other important association positions as well as being a Lieutenant in the Submarine Company, Victorian Engineers from 1894 and transferring to the Reserve of Officers in 1900. He resigned his commission in 1912 but when war broke out in 1914 he was recommissioned in July 1915 into the Australian Engineers and promoted to Captain initially and then in 1916 to Major. In 1918-19 he was Director of Works in the Department of the Chief of Ordnance. He transferred to the Reserves in 1920 and retired in 1925 with the rank of Major. He died on 15 October 1946 at Castle Hill, NSW.


