There were two convict women named Mary Boyd. The first was convicted at Bristol Quarter Sessions on 9 April 1819 to transportation for seven years. She was one of 120 prisoners transported to NSW on the ship 'Morley' arriving at Sydney on 17 May 1820. The other was convicted at Central Criminal Court on 23 November 1846 to transportation for seven years. She was one of 170 convicts transported to Van Diemen's Land on the ship 'Asia' arriving on 9 March 1847.





Forget Me Not token, by convict or ship's boy, (35mm) copper (possibly a cartwheel penny 1797), engraved on obverse with a ship, lighthouse, all-seeing eye, anchor, palm tree, coconut pile, water well and the words, 'Dear Mother' at the top and the year, 1825, at the bottom, reverse engraved, 'Forget Me/Not/Wm Bath/Aged 15', and a small bird above with a message letter in its beak. *Pierced hole at top for suspension, very fine and very scarce*.

John Chapman was a waterman from Middlesex who was convicted in May 1832 of stealing a tea caddy. He was sentenced to 14 years transportation to the Colony of New South Wales. He was transported on the 'Retribution' leaving England on 30 May 1833 and arrived at New South Wales on 18 October 1833.

There were two convict boys named William Foster. The first, aged 13, was convicted for housebreaking on 7 March 1836 and transported to Van Diemen's Land on the 'Royal Sovereign' in August 1836. The other, aged 16, was convicted on 4 April 1836 for stealing fowls and transported to Van Diemen's Land on the 'Royal Sovereign' in July 1836.

Convict love token, a George III 1797 cartwheel penny shaved nearly smooth on obverse and engraved, 'No Dens/ July 8.1836/T.Hautenville'. Reverse with deep channel where it appears an item with an inscribed scroll has been struck, several scratches on obverse from shaving surface, otherwise very good.

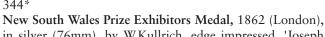

Joseph Trickett, the Clerk of Works at Woolwich in England and a civil engineer arrived in New South Wales on 14 March 1854. He was also a member of the Royal Engineers, a detachment of which had been sent to Sydney to establish a branch of the Royal Mint. Trickett selected the location and supervised the establishment of the Sydney Mint which was opened on  $14\,$ May 1855. Joseph Trickett was involved in many other aspects of scientific work and was also heavily involved in the development of the municipality of Woollahra and for many years was a councillor. He returned to England after he retired from his position at the Sydney Mint and died there on 3 January 1878.

Medals dated 1879 are sought after as these prize medals were awarded to those exhibits judged at the Sydney Exhibition Grounds rather than at the agricultural society grounds. In the 1879 competition well known breeder E.B.Woodhouse exhibited with imported as well as Mount Gilead bred stock. Mount Gilead is about 58kms south-west of Sydney, part of the Macarthur region. One of his entries, Miss Fox, was awarded second place in the section, Durham Cow, three years.

George Thornton (23 December 1819 - 23 November 1901) was an Australian merchant and politician, serving as a Sydney Municipal Council Alderman, Mayor of Sydney and member of the New South Wales Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council. Thornton was born in Sydney, the son of Samuel Thornton (son of another Samuel, a woollen manufacturer of

Barnsley, Yorkshire) and Sarah (n e Madden). Sarah was transported to Australia as a punishment for larceny; Samuel followed, arriving in Sydney in 1814 as a free settler, and was granted land by the colonial government.

George Thornton was educated at the Australian College on Jamieson Street, Sydney; he went into work as a custom-house and ship agent, later becoming an import merchant. Having been a magistrate in Sydney for many years, Thornton served also as a director of various financial institutions such as the City Bank of Sydney. He was elected to the Sydney Municipal Council in November 1847, and served as mayor in 1853 and 1857. Thornton was elected as a member for Sydney City from 1858 to 1859. In May 1861 he was appointed to the Legislative Council when Governor Young agreed to flood the council in support of John Robertson's land bills, but this was frustrated when the President of the Council, Sir William Burton refused to swear in the new members and resigned with others forcing the proroguement (suspension) of the Council. He represented Goldfields West in 1867 and 1868. In 1877 he was appointed for life to the Council. George Thornton was a commissioner of the 1879 Sydney International Exhibition and was a judge for Class 313 Musical Instruments. He also won a bronze medal in that class and was awarded a large silver medal for his services.

Thornton was the foundation President of the Sydney Rowing Club and was instrumental in the club's formation and growth from 1870 until his death. He served as President of the New South Wales Rowing Association from 1879 till his death. Thornton died of dysentery in 1901 at Parramatta, survived by his wife, Mary Ann (daughter of John Solomon, of Sydney) and daughter Frances; he was predeceased by a son and a daughter.

Prior to entering the army he was an English barrister and in that capacity did some little practice in Sydney where he also made an unsuccessful attempt to start a daily newspaper.

At the exhibition Langlands Foundry entered the machinery section with a locomotive engine and also railway carriage wheels, winning a medal for the latter. Langlands Foundry also cast the big bell, the largest cast in Australia up until then, weighing nearly two tons, which was for the Emerald Hill town-hall clock but was hung in the main building during the exhibition and used to give a warning to patrons that the exhibition closing time for the day was approaching.

Samuel Davenport was born in England on 5 March 1818. He arrived in Australia in 1843 and settled in South Australia at Macclesfield. He was elected to South Australia's first Legislative Council in 1857, serving twice as Commissioner of Public Works. He also represented his state as a commissioner at the London International Exhibition in 1851 and at the following exhibitions - Philadelphia 1876, Sydney 1879, Melbourne 1880, Colonial and Indian Exhibition 1886 and the Melbourne International Exhibition 1888.

Davenport's other public roles included serving as president of the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society for seven years, first president of the Chamber of Manufactures for twenty years until 1888 as well as first president of the South Australian branch of the Royal Geographical Society of Australasia for ten years until 1894. He was also a director of several public companies. He was knighted in 1884 and in 1886 was appointed Knight Commander of the Order of St Michael and St George (KCMG). He also had several property interests including vineyards and olive groves. Sir Samuel Davenport KCMG died at Beaumont on 3 September 1906 and was buried at Walkerville Cemetery in South Australia. The Davenport Ranges about 760km north of Adelaide and the Hundred of Davenport in the County of Frome were named in his honour as well as the Electoral District of Davenport and he established the Beaumont Common for the local people of the town of Beaumont to be used as a reserve.

These medals relate to the 'Danedite' property in Camperdown. Originally formed as a part of the Purrumbete Estate taken up by three brothers Thomas (1809-1875), John (1811-1877) and Peter (1817-1885) Manifold who emigrated from Bromborough, Cheshire, England. Thomas arrived in Van Diemen's Land on 23 January 1828 followed by John and Peter with the rest of the family on 8 July 1831. Initially obtaining land on the west bank of the Tamar River, by December 1838 they also acquired land at Lake Purrumbete in Victoria where they bred sheep and cattle. On the death of the pioneer proprietors the estate, comprising 48,000 acres was divided into four - Purrumbete, Talindert, Wiridgil and Danedite for the next generation.

The Mayor (Ald, J. C. Reid) presided. The following resolutions were carried: -

- 1. That in the opinion of this meeting the heroic conduct of the lifeboat crew, and also of the master and crew of the pilot steamer Ajax, in going to the assistance in the height of the gale of those on board the schooner Alpena, when in great danger, off the port of Newcastle, on last Monday morning, and rescuing all hands, including a lady (the captain's wife) is worthy of all commendation, and sympathetically appeals to all classes of the community.
- 2. That all present form themselves into a committee (with power to add to their number) for the purpose of practically carrying out the previous resolution.
- 3. That subscription lists be opened for the purpose of obtaining funds for this worthy object.

The town clerk (Mr. Scott Holland) was appointed treasurer. A collection taken up at the meeting realised a substantial sum.

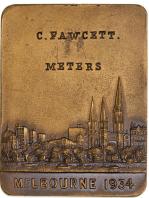

RSRHS: Case number 1940/09 - case notes state - Eric John Edward Fleming, 3rd Officer, S.S. Mangola, c/- Burns Philp & Co. Ltd., Bridge Street, Sydney. At about 8p.m. on the 30th September, 1939, at Port Darwin, the chief wireless operator of the R.A.F.A. steamer "Kurumba", a man named Oswald, fell overboard from the Mangola which was lying at the wharf. Fleming dived overboard and swam to Oswald, who had been carried some 400 yards from the ship due to the strong current prevailing at the time. They were picked up by a shore launch. These waters are badly infested with sharks and alligators (sic actually saltwater crocodiles).

In the Townsville Daily Bulletin, Friday 13 October 1939, Darwin Notes, page 12 there was a brief report of the incident as follows, 'A member of the crew of one of the boats in port had a narrow escape from drowning when he fell overboard on Monday night. Another of the crew jumped in to save him, but the seven-knot tide swept them well out into the harbour before the Qantas Empire Co.'s launch was able to meet and to rescue them.'
