Sarah Elizabeth Oram, born Christmas Day, 25Dec1860, at Cirencester, England; Appt'd Nursing Sister with British Army Nursing Service 01May1886; noted in Egypt 1897; Emb.21Jan1900 from Southampton for South Africa as Superintendent Sister in charge of 11 nurses; to Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service as Matron 26May1902; to South Africa as Principal Matron 19Jun1911; arrived Egypt 10May1915 and to duty as Matron in Chief Egypt 1915-1919; to Retired List Apr1920; Died unmarried on 26Jun1946 at South Kensington, England and cremated at Kensal Green Crematorium, London.

Mentioned in the book, 'Australian Women at War', by Patsy Adam-Smith as having introduced new uniforms for Australian nurses. Also mentioned several times and described in the Australian World War One Medical Official History as a 'capable and gracious lady in charge of Australian and British nurses.' (Vol 1, pp199 and 764).

There was an Albert John Oram, possibly Sarah Oram's brother, who arrived in NSW from England when he was 16 and who became a NSW Railways' station-master, serving at several regional locations. After he retired he settled at Porters Retreat in NSW and died on 11 October 1938 in Bathurst District Hospital.

CANBERRA Wednesday. - Mr Oliver Hogue, Canberra representative of The Sunday Sun, has been appointed Public Relations Officer for the Royal Tour in 1954. Mr. Hogue has been given special leave of absence by Associated Newspapers Ltd. Minister-in-Charge of the Royal Tour, Mr. Harrison, said that Mr. Hogue had already begun duty on the staff of the Director-General of the Royal Tour, Lieut-General F.H. Berryman, at Victoria Barracks, Sydney. One Of Australia's best-known political commentators, Mr. Hogue has had wide experience, and is highly regarded as an organiser. He was appointed by the Chifley Labor Government to a similar post for the tour which had to be cancelled because of the late King's illness.'

The following year it was reported in The Newcastle Morning Herald and Miners' Advocate newspaper on Friday 2 April 1954, page 1 as follows.

'HONOUR FOR FORMER NEWCASTLE MAN

By Ian Healy

Mr. Oliver Hogue, whom the Queen honoured at Government House, Perth, yesterday afternoon, is said to have lived "in a pressure cooker" for the past two months. He was Public Relations Officer for the Commonwealth Royal Tour. Behind every story of the tour, every newsreel, every photo that was taken by Pressmen of the Queen, was his helping hand. For months before the Queen arrived, as he had for two earlier tours that were postponed, he worked to prepare the way for reporters to file their stories to journals throughout the world.

For 58 days and 14,000 miles he led the Press party covering the tour. Whenever the Queen appeared in public, he was there, not far from her, seeing that reporters got where they had to go, that photographers were in the best positions to get their pictures. He conducted daily briefings, solved individual problems all of them had, and supervised their accommodation, luggage and travel arrangements. Not one piece of luggage was lost. It was "the biggest public relations task in Australia's history," and "Olly," as every one knew him, carried it out with efficiency and amazing patience.

The Queen made him a Commander of the Royal Victorian Order. Mr. Hogue began his career as a "Newcastle Morning Herald" journalist. He was educated at Newcastle Boys' High School. He left the "Herald" to become a Sydney newspaper's special writer in Canberra, and before his appointment for the Royal Tour was President of the Press Gallery in Parliament House. Although his home is in Canberra, he moved temporarily to Sydney before the tour began so that he could have his wife and four sons near him while he worked.

Mrs. Hogue was formerly Miss Molly May, who was also a member of the "Herald" reporting staff. Mrs. H. C. Wells, of Speers Point, is Mr. Hogue's sister. Mr. Hogue's assistant on the tour was Major Gordon S. Osborne, a Regular Army officer, also adept at the art of "smoothing the way." At the same investiture yesterday, the Queen made Major Osborne a Member of the Victorian Order (5th class).'

Stephen Lomas (also recorded as Lomax) appears on 2Bn, 48th Foot muster rolls at various countries and locations and on 24 July 1815 was promoted to Corporal. He was then promoted to Sergeant on 25 February 1817. The 48th Foot proceeded to New South Wales 25 March 1817 and arrived on 24 June 1817. Lomas appears to have arrived on 11 April 1818 on the Guildford with a shipment of convicts. He was promoted to Colour Sergeant on 4 July 1818 and then on 21 December 1818 he was reduced to Private. On 25 December 1821-24 March 1822 he was at Liverpool, Sydney, NSW and 25 June-24 September 1822 he was at Parramatta, Sydney, NSW. On the roll he, along with a number of other men, was listed as 'Supernumery to the Establishment' since 25 July 1822. He continued service with the 2nd in NSW until 24 March 1824 at which time he transferred to 3rd regiment continuing service in NSW until 24 May 1824. There are no further entries on the roll. Stephen Lomas was discharged 14 November 1824.

This medal was awarded whilst the regiment was serving in Australia, 1817-24, and most, if not all, of the approximately 20 known recipients served in New South Wales. It is the first military medal to have been issued in Australia. There is strong evidence that the medals were engraved by Samuel Clayton, transported to Australia for seven years in 1816 and working as a painter, engraver and silversmith in Sydney as early as January of the following year.

Adam Tilly was born at St John's Antigua. When he attested at Gibraltar on 25 December 1799 at age 10 he was recorded as a labourer. He was promoted to Corporal 25 January 1817 and reduced to Private 24 May 1817. Adam Tilly died 11 June 1824, at the age of 34, at St Thomas Mount, Madras, India long before the Military General Service Medal he was entitled to could be claimed by him.

Research provided with the lot states that Tilley was sick/absent at the retreat from Burgos and taken as POW and remained as such from October 1812 to June 1814 (approx).

While he was stationed in Australia Adam Tilly and his wife, Jane, had three children, Thomas born 10 September 1818, Sarah born 4 December 1820 and George born 15 June 1823. All three were baptised at St Philip's Church in Sydney, NSW

William Clarke was born at Hadleigh, Essex, England on 4 June 1817. He enlisted as a private in the 40th (2nd Somersetshire) Regiment of Foot and fought at the Battle of Maharajpoor on 29 December 1843. The regiment returned to Ireland and in 1852 embarked from Cork on the steamship 'Vulcan' bound for Port Phillip Bay, Melbourne, Victoria. William Clarke is recorded on the muster roll (copy attached). The regiment helped suppress the Eureka Rebellion in 1854 and then fought in the Second Maori War 1860-61. It is possible that William Clarke may have deserted with others at Ballarat in 1855 to prospect for gold. He died at Ballarat, Victoria in 1890 at the age of 73.

'DR. W. A. HARRISON, BURNIE

British War Medal is the only medal entitlement.

After having been in failing health for some years Dr. William Atkinson Harrison died at his home "Breckenborough," Burnie, yesterday at the age of 81 years. Dr. Harrison was born at Banton Grange, Westmoreland, England, and graduated at the Edinburgh University with the degrees of M.B. and M.Ch. in 1880, and B.Sc. (public health) in 1883. He was the silver medallist of his year in midwifery. For a time he practised at Haslington, England, with his father, the late Dr. Edward Harrison, and also at Pontefract. Dr. Harrison then went to New Zealand, and later to Victoria, where he practised for about a year.

He then came to Tasmania as surgeon to the company constructing the Zeehan-Strahan railway line. He received a Government appointment at Perth, which kept him in West Australia for seven years. Among other positions which he occupied there, he was a magistrate and a protector of aboriginals on the goldfields. Dr. Harrison practised at Queenstown for some years, and on his return to Tasmania went to St. Marys.

When the 1914-18 war broke out, he went first to Claremont camp and later to Ross and Meadows, then to Egypt and hospital ships. After the war Dr. Harrison was appointed to take charge of the Beechworth asylum, Victoria, and he occupied that position for some years. He returned again to Tasmania and took up residence at Burnie. He practised there for a time before accepting a position as city health officer to the Brisbane City Council. He then returned to Burnie, where he has lived ever since.

He is survived by his wife, who was Miss Reynolds, a daughter of Mr. Reynolds, the contractor for the Zeehan-Strahan railway. A short service will be held this morning at St. George's Church of England by the rector (Rev. F. J. McCabe), and the body will then be brought to Launceston, arriving at the Carr Villa Crematorium at 3 p.m.'
