Mr Geo.C.Levey was Secretary to the London Commission of the Adelaide Jubilee International Exhibition. He also applied for the position of secretary to the 1888 Melbourne Centennial Exhibition Committee but his services were declined.

George Collins Levey, journalist and politician, was born in London on 13 April 1835. He arrived in Melbourne with his two brothers in 1851. He toured Western Europe and wrote for the English press, was at one time editor and chief proprietor of the Herald and contributor and occasionally editor of the Age newspaper. For a time he was also a Member of Parliament. In 1879 he was appointed secretary to the commissioners at the Sydney Exhibition and later held the same post representing Victoria and other colonies at exhibitions in Melbourne in 1872, 1875 and 1880-81, London and Vienna in 1873, Philadelphia in 1876, Paris in 1878 (awarded Legion of Honour), Amsterdam in 1883, Crystal Palace in 1884, Adelaide in 1887, Tasmania in 1894 and to the colonial committee of the British royal commission to the Paris Exhibition in 1900. He was appointed CMG in 1878 for his services as an eminently successful emissary for the colonies. He also served on the royal commission inquiring into the Kelly outbreak and performance of the police. He died in London on 13 April 1919. See his full biography by Suzanne G. Mellor published in Australian Dictionary of Biography, Vol 5, (MUP), 1974.

Parry-Okeden, William Edward (1840-1926), born in the Snowy River district of an English pioneer settler, he gained much experience in Victoria and later Queensland. In 1870, he commenced employment in the Queensland Public Service. He married in Maryborough in 1873. He was president of the Jockey Club at Charleville and Gayndah. The Charleville Times later wrote of the time "when Parry-Okeden was king". In the 1890's he was picked by the Government to restore order after the shearer strikes. He was appointed Commissioner in 1895 and because of his understanding of the aborigines he became Protector of Aborigines. As Police Commissioner he brought about much reform. He was appointed I.S.O in 1903 and retired in 1905. The Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria was an appropriate time to recognise the men and officers of the force with this unique medal.

James Patrick McMahon was born in Australia in 1868, the son of a migrant from County Clare in Ireland who developed a very successful carrying company as well as investing in Sydney real estate. James was a Colonel in the NSW Lancers and went to Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897. He was also a prominent rugby union player and also managed the Australian Rugby Union team that toured England and America in 1908-9.

The Australian team did not have a team name and when they arrived in England some newspaper reports referred to them as the 'Rabbits'. In a letter that James McMahon, the team tour manager, wrote back to Sydney he stated, 'That horrible expression, 'rabbits', has arrived, and in some of the papers that is what we are termed. However, I have written to the Press pointing out that it is most objectionable, and we are now being termed the Wallabies. The `Daily Mail' puts it that we are `on the wallaby'. When his father died in 1914 James succeeded his father as owner of the transport business which he converted from horse drawn vehicles to motor vehicles. He was well known for his activities with the Royal Agricultural Society, NRMA, Master Carriers' Association, Chamber of Agriculture, Employers' Federation and as a member of the City Council from 1930 to 1950. At the Royal Easter Show in Sydney in 1937 and 1938 Lt-Col. J.McMahon was the Ringmaster and Chairman of the Wine Section Printing & Advertising Committees. James McMahon died at his home in Redfern at the age of 83. It is interesting to note that he was the uncle of William 'Billy' McMahon, born at Redfern in 1908. His father was William McMahon who was James' brother. William 'Billy' McMahon held various ministerial positions from 1951 to 1971 and as leader of the Liberal Party was the Prime Minister of Australia from 10 March 1971 to 5 December 1972.

A unit named the Royal African Corps was in service in British West Africa as early as 1804. In that year its strength was increased to 10 companies. In the following year African men were recruited for the Corps, first from the disbanded York Rangers, later from freemen in Sierra Leone. In 1808, the Corps were divided, six companies being detached and sent to the West Indies as the Royal York Rangers. By 1809 the Royal African Corps had three companies at Goree, three in Senegal, and one in Sierra Leone. By 1817, three of the companies were composed almost entirely of Africans. By 1819 the Corps were disbanded. The last colonel of the Royal African Corps was Charles Lyragh McCarthy (1784-1824), later Brigadier General Sir Charles McArthy. He was governor of Sierra Leone 1812-14. He fell in battle against the Ashanti, who took his head and made a cup of his skull.
