This is an interesting numismatic medal. Jos, Toribio Medina (21 October 1852 - 1930) was a Chilean bibliographer. He was born at Santiago, Chile, and was educated for the bar. His first publication, when a very young man, was a metrical translation of Longfellow's Evangeline. When twenty-two he was appointed secretary to the legation at Lima, Peru. After his return he published a history of Chilean literature (1878), and a work upon the aboriginal tribes (1884). In this latter year he was appointed secretary of legation in Spain, and availed himself of the opportunity of examining the treasures of the old Spanish libraries. These researches, repeated on subsequent visits to Spain, and also to France and England, enriched him with a mass of historical and bibliographical material. Among his publications may be mentioned the Biblioteca hispano-americana, a catalogue of all books and pamphlets relating to Spanish America printed in Spain; the Biblioteca hispano-chilena, a similar work, commenced in 1897; the standard and magnificent history of printing in the La Plata countries (1892); comprehensive works on the Inquisition in Chile, Peru and the Philippines; and the standard treatise on South American medals (1899) and several others on coins from South American countries. In addition, Medina produced the fullest bibliographies yet attainable of books printed at Lima, Mexico and Manila, and a number of memoirs and other minor writings. No other man had rendered anything like the same amount of service to the literary history and bibliography of the Spanish colonies.

Recommended for VC (citation): LG. On the 9th February 1900 Private Kruger of the 1st West Australian Mounted Infantry was a member of a patrol of 30 men ordered to hold an exposed position on an isolated hill at Slingersfontein. From 6 in the morning until 7 in the evening the patrol defied the Boers who surrounded and vastly out-numbered them. At about 10.00am in the morning Sergeant Hensman moved out to an exposed position on the right flank in an attempt to repel a party of Boers who were closing in on the outpost. He was badly wounded and collapsed with a shattered right thigh. Private Kruger immediately left his trench and, under heavy fire, bound up the Sergeant's wounds and built a stone parapet around him, the Boers then attempted to rush the position but Private Kruger killed four of them with rifle fire. Kruger was wounded in the hand and had his helmet and bandolier holed by enemy fire. When darkness fell the West Australians were able to infiltrate out through the Boer lines. Private Kruger refused medical assistance for himself and insisted on leading the Doctor and stretcher bearers back through the enemy lines to recover Sergeant Hensman. The General Officer commanding congratulated the 30 men on their courage and determination. Their stand against 300 Boers had entirely frustrated the enemy's attempt to turn the flank of the position. The position so magnificently defended was named 'West Australian Hill'.

The team mainly comprised leading university academics from Australia and New Zealand, including Percy Correll, a physicist from Adelaide. Sailing on the Newfoundland steam-powered *Aurora*, the team landed at Macquarie Island on 11 December 1911 and built winter quarters in Commonwealth Bay, where parts of the settlement remain to this day.

The treacherous and unforgiving conditions of the continent were demonstrated by the incident that occurred during a sledding trip on 13 December 1912. A concealed crevasse saw Belgrade Ninnis, six sleigh dogs and the majority of supplies plunge into the icy abyss. The survivors, Mawson, Xavier Mertz and six dogs, were forced to attempt to return to Main Base, a distance of over 300 miles with just 10 days rations. In fierce and freezing weather, Mawson, with blackening feet and verging on delirium, was the only member to return alive. Merz had died on 8 January and the dogs were all killed for meat.



The aircraft was at a height of 1500 feet when Essendon was reached but despite the difficult conditions the pilot, by his skill and coolness in the face of adversity, displayed expert judgement and airmanship and executed a single engine landing at night with no damage to the aircraft or injury to himself or his crew'.

In this action Pte Bayliss displayed all the qualities of gallantry and devotion, worthy of the highest commendation and praise in the unselfish devotion he displayed towards his Coy'.






