

AUSTRALIAN COMMONWEALTH COINS

THE 1921 HOARD

The following lots are a family holding which we will call the "1921 hoard". It contains Australian and British coins that were put aside from circulation in early 1921. To suit our auction it has been split between the highest grade coins, which are included in the Tuesday evening session, and the volume lots in well circulated condition in the Sixth Session on Wednesday morning. The total estimated value of the hoard, which includes 18 half sovereigns, is \$125,000. It is a time capsule of coins circulating at the time in the central coast area of NSW. The amount of wear is considerable considering that most of the Australian coins had as little as ten years of circulation. The 1918 to 1921 coins show less wear and the 1921's are close to uncirculated. The hoard has been carefully examined with all coins being weighed and the details recorded. It will be the subject of a major paper in a forthcoming NAA publication. At the time of its deposit some 20% of the silver currency in circulation was British, some of which had been in circulation since the 1850's. The face value of the Australian silver coins is \$284.18 (2651 coins) and of the British coins \$68.58 (670 coins). No halfcrowns were present in the hoard as these ceased to circulate after the introduction of regular Australian silver coins in 1910. No 1921 plain threepences were present as they were introduced late in 1921 after new dies without M mint mark were made. Only a small number of 1920M (Melbourne mint) shillings (made December 1920 - January 1921) and 1921 star (Sydney mint) shillings (made early in 1921) are present. This together with the overall pattern of wear suggests a hoard being put together in the period February - May of 1921. The presence of English coins of George V indicates the return of troops from the Great War with coins acquired in England. A likely reason the hoard was put away was the fear of the pending debasement of Australian silver coins to 0.500 fine from the current 0.925 fineness. Australia didn't proceed on this possible debasement as the ruling world price of silver became stable but the coinage in Britain had been debased in 1920 to this lower fineness.
