Colour Sergeant Thomas McGuire of the 1/48th Regiment was the holder of a spirit retailing license. Boyle Thomas offered one gallon of rum as a reward for the return of a boat (HT Gazette No 35, June 25 1817). McGuire was licensed to sell spirits at the Barracks only to the Military. 
