## SIEGENOTES

In 1884 General Charles G Gordon (known as Chinese Gordon of 55 days at Peking fame) was sent to the Sudan by the British Government in order to arrange evacuation of Egyptian soldiers, civilians and their families put in danger by the revolt of the religious leader known as the M ahdi against British occupation. When the general arrived at K hartoum hefound the Treasury nearly empty and so to pay his troops, who were already three months in arrears with their pay, he requested funds from the Egyptian Treasury. Unfortunately, the money never got past an Egyptian official at Berber.

By now the city was under siege and to avoid desertion of his troops, Gordon decided to issue his own money. The first notes were issued on A pril 25, 1884 and all notes have this common date. Gordon personally guaranteed the notes otherw ise the men would not accept them. A large quantity of the notes were actually signed personally by Gordon because local merchants refused to accept notes printed with a hectographic signature. The wanted the real thing. The notes were issued in various denominations from one piastre to five thousand piastres.

O ver 90,000 notes were printed however when K hartoum fell, the M ahdi decreed that possession of the notes was punishable by death. $N$ onetheless some notes were smuggled out of the city to Egypt only to reside in the vaults of the Caisse de la Dette for three decades. When they were rediscovered, the notes totalling nearly 3,500 were to be sold to raise money for a fund in memory of General Gordon. Prior to this how ever, historical research was conducted on them and although some were sold for charitable purposes a number were believed destroyed during World War II.

The number of surviving Siege of K hartoum, General Gordon notes that have survived is not exactly known however one fact is certain and that is the scarcity of the notes available to collectors. A selection of these notes is on offer in the following 51 lots, some actually signed by General Gordon, truly great historical reminders of a significant event in world history.
