Detective Constable John Rutherford Metropolitan Police. L G 01Jan1924 'At about 10.30pm on 28th July 1922, Constable Rutherford while off duty, was in the saloon bar of the 'Red Bull' Public House, Grays Inn Road, when six men entered, three of whom he knew belonging to a local gang known as the 'Camden Town Gang'. As the men entered, members of a rival gang, already inside the pub, moved towards them and forced them into the street. The Constable followed, and saw one man fire a revolver. Most of the men were carrying firearms, and as the two gangs went down Portpool Lane followed by the Constable, several shots were fired in his direction. One of the leaders shouted, 'Go back Rutherford' and fired a shot at him. Constable Rutherford caught the man, who said 'Go away or I'll do it again'. Rutherford then knocked the man down, took his revolver, and arrested him'.

He is an officer of great tact, ability and courage, and his work has led in many instances to the arrest of some of the most desperate absconders of the revolutionary party'. Bar to KPM L G 01Jan1934 pg 15 'On 22nd May 1933, on receipt of secret information that some known desparate terrorists were in concealment in a house in Cornwallis Street, a composite police party under the command of Rai Ban Behari Mukherji Bahadur, Officiating Deputy Commissioner of Police, Special Branch, proceeded to the spot. On nearing the room where the absconders were in hiding, one of them opened fire and wounded an officer of the Intelligence Branch. Despite a heavy revolver duel between the Police and the absconders, Rai Ban Behari Mukherji Bahadur stuck to his post and successfully arrested the absconders. The whole of the arrangements made in connection with the search had been made by this officer. The three absconders arrested - Dinesh Mazundar, Nalini Das and Jagadananda Mukharji - are extremely desparate characters'. Both awards have excellent citations for anti-terrorist work and duties in relation to the control of the revolutionary movement. This medal would constitute a significant addition to a collection in particular Indian Police and especially the Bengal Province and the active terrorist movement in that Province. Edwin Alfred John Barnes, M.B.E. Senior Inspector Aden Police Force. Grounds of Recommendation for award of the King's Police Medal - Mr Barnes entered the Aden Police Force in December 1893. His record has been unblemished, as a Police Inspector he has always done his duties to the entire satisfaction of everyone, however his main use in Aden has been that of a confidential agent to the Residency. Having lived in Aden all his life he has obtained a unique personal knowledge of not only the local population but a large majority of the people who come to Aden either for business or passing through and has acquired a full knowledge of Arabic and Somali often being called upon to perform various duties requiring energy, intelligence, tact and trustworthiness and he has in every case shown that he possessed those qualities. In the early days of the war Inspector Barnes did valuable work in organising the Coolie Corps. Subsequently he has been the means of settling many labour difficulties and was also employed in the raising of the first two hundred men for the local labour corps. It was on account of his qualifications deputed especially for duty with the troops which attacked and took Sheikh Said in November 1914 and was present with the troops throughout these operations. Subsequently he was sent to Khor Omeria after the Arabs had fired on the boards of H.M.S.'Dufferin'. Though no result accrued at the time it was due to his influence that the Sheikh subsequently came into Aden and the situation was cleared. He has exhibited conspicuous devotion to duty and his services in connection with the war have been of a political and very special nature. MBE L G 03Jun1927 No.33280 pg 3617. The struggle continued however, and Dhanna Singh managed to explode a Mill's bomb which was concealed on his person, thereby killing himself and five police officers on the spot and fatally injuring three others, including Mr Horton. Mr Jenkin was very seriously wounded, and, after about six months in hospital, where he underwent numerous operations, he has been sent to England on a years leave. In view of the conspicuous gallantry displayed by Mr Jenkin in this affair, he is recommended most strongly for the award of the King's Police Medal.'

KPM Gazette of India 01Jan1930 'This officer was in command of a party of Military Police from Loimwe that took action against a Muhso Hkunli (Pretender) who having collected armed followers was defying law and order in the Kengtung State in the Southern Shan States. The Assistant Superintendent in charge, having been unsuccessful in his efforts to make the Hkunli see reason and give up his warlike attitude was forced to call upon Captain Dunn and his party to attack the Hkunli and his followers in their bulletproof fort. It is reported that this fort must have taken years to complete, that is was perfect in its structure and its disposition and that special trenches had been dug for greater protection during rifle fire and for masking of men in case of an attack over the top. Owing to the disposition of the fort Captain Dunn was only able to make a reconnaisance from a ridge six miles away and found that the position could only be attacked from two sides. It was by this skilful reconnaissance (as there was no information available as to strength, etc., of the Hkunli's followers) that Captain Dunn was able to make his plan of attack so that the fort was eventually taken without casualties and the Hkunli and his followers were forced to flee. It is reported that the Hkunli and many of his followers were killed. The operations commenced on 9th March 1929 and ended on the 27th April 1929.' With some research.

Jemadar Raz Muhammad Khan and Naik Lal Din whilst serving at Manji Post of the Frontier Constabulary effected a most gallant rescue of a villager named Umar Khan, son of Mir Khan, of village Ragnazi, who was in danger of drowning in the Gomal River. 'On the 25th July 1929, an old man Umar Khan went to the bed of the Gomal River to collect driftwood and was cut off by the river which suddenly came down in a spate. For two days and nights he remained marooned on a sandbank just clear of the water. The local police and villagers had made repeated attempts and were unsuccessful in their attempts to reach the man. None of the local people, themselves strong swimmers, knowing the currents and the treacherous mature of the river dared attempt to swim the flood. The river at the joint where Umar Khan was cut off was some 200 yards in width and was over seven feet deep. The sandbank on which the man was stranded was equidistant from both banks. The chief obstacles were the treacherous nature of the river which is full of quicksands and whirlpools and the force of the current is swift and strong. On the third day the man was in danger of succumbing to hunger and exhaustion, the villagers came to Manjhi Post for assistance. On hearing of Umar Khans plight Jemadar Khan and Naik Din at once left for the river bank. Both are strong swimmers but realised full well the risks they ran of themselves drowning. Despite this they swam out with the aid of an inflated bullock skin and with great difficulty managed to bring the old man to safety. Both the rescuers displayed gallantry of the highest order. Neither of them belonged to this locality so they had no interest in the rescued man and might well have copied the example of his friends in declining to risk the passage. The Gomal River has claimed many victims including men of the Frontier Constabulary so there were plenty of reasons for detering the men. They are to be congratulated on what most people would have considered a humanly impossible feat. It is noteworthy that Jemadar Khan has previously been commended for saving life'. At about 3.15am on 21st May 1942, a Canadian soldier stationed in Surrey, stole a Thomson machine gun and a revolver from the armoury at his depot, and then held up the picket at the transport park, and stole a lorry, and headed for London. Cordons were set up across the main raod at Bagshot and also at Egham, but the man drove straight through both of them. Constables Lindsell and Salter were directed to set up a road block at Staines Bridge, West London, and with Constables Carpenter and Grant they waited. When the lorry approached, Constable Lindsell switched on the headlights of his car, blinding the fugitive, causing him to swerve into the kerb. Constables Carpenter and Grant jumped up onto the cab of the lorry and disarmed the soldier before he could use any of the weapons. Air 2/8752 Recommendation (21st April 1941): 'Sergeant Leavers and Sergeant Overheu were the pilot and Observer respectively of the leading aircraft of a section detailed to attack a large enemy convoy on 18th April, 1941. Sergeant Leavers displayed great determination and good leadership in the face of heavy anti-aircraft fire in giving his section a good tactical run-up to the target and his Observer, Sergeant Overheu, displayed considerable skill and coolness in scoring two direct hits on a large ship in the convoy. After delivering his attack, Sergeant Leavers saw the leader of No.2 Section shot down in flames. He immediately gathered together two of the other aircraft and brought his section on the formation leader. On 31st March, 1941, this crew successfully attacked an enemy destroyer escorting a convoy af 13 ships. Segeant Leavers pressed home his attack and whilst his Observer scored two direct hits on the destroyer with his bombs, the pilot raked the deck with his machine gun, many of the ship's crew being seen to fall. After bomb release, Segeant Leavers was so low that he had to lift his port wing to avoid collision with the mast of the destroyer. After the attack, the destroyer was observed to be slewed round and was listing badly to port with black smoke pouring from the stern. This crew has now completed 16 sorties involving 57 hours flying during which their teamwork as a crew has been of a very high standard. Their attacks have always been pressed home with great determination and they have always brought back the maximum information, supplemented whenever possible by good photographs. I recommend the immediate award of the Distinguished Flying Medal to these two N.C.O.s because I notice that in sortie after sortie, they have set

a magnificent example to the other members of the squadron and, indeed, the day bomber force, many of whom have only recently started operational flying, requiring a high standard of determination and morale.' Ian Overheu, commercial traveller, born 28Jul1917 Geraldton, Western Australia, ran away from home to study engineering at Sydney University before going to NZ; joined RNZAF Mar1940; served with RAF No 21 Blenheim Sqn; 21Apr1941 recommended for immediate award of DFM, approved; in an article in The Argus newspaper, Saturday May 24, 1941 p.5 under heading 'Hope Dad's Pleased' / Perth Airman's Decoration, Sgt-Observer Overheu said, 'I hope father is pleased with the award. We had a family dispute and I left. I want to return to sheep farming after the war.'; KIA 16Jun1941 when his aircraft hit the mast of the vessel he was attacking and crashed into the sea off the Frisian Islands.
