Soon after James II's death in exile, in 1701, his son was recognised as James III, King of England, by France, Spain, the Papal States and Modena, despite the fact that William III occupied the English throne at that time. James (III) lived in France as a guest of Louis XIV, but the War of the Spanish Succession ended with the Treaty of Utrecht in 1713, and one of the conditions was that he should be expelled from France. After a failed attempted invasion of Britain, James returned to France, where he remained until his death in 1766. Princess Louisa Maria Teresa Stuart (1692-1712) was the last child of James II. She was born in France at St Germain-en-Laye during her parents' exile, but died of smallpox aged 19 in 1712, the date of this medal.

Lewis Pingo (1743-1830), London. Die sinker, engraver, gem engraver and artist. Assistant Engraver, Royal Mint, 1776; Chief Engraver, 1779, retired 1815. Best known for his 1787 'Spade' guinea, Cook Royal Society Medal 1784, 1787 sixpence and shilling and Seige of Gibraltar Medal 1782.

The first 'Pallets' were awarded in 1767 (see 'Tickets & Passes of Great Britain and Ireland' by W.J. Davis & A.W. Waters, ref.361, 362 - p.148). This example (gilt) is specifically mentioned in Leonard Forrer's 'Biographical Dictionary of Medallists' (p134). Pingo was also awarded gold Pallets in 1771 and 1772.

For additional information on Lewis Pingo, see Christopher Eimer's 'The Pingo Family & Medal Making in 18th-Century Britain', British Art Medal Trust, 1998. This medal, while quite scarce is extremely rare as one of numismatic association, perhaps doubly so to someone as important as Lewis Pingo.

The only example of a Pallet offered in recent times seems to have been in a London auction in 2010. It was a silver piece estimated at £400 - £600, to a pedestrian recipient of no numismatic importance.



George Gordon Byron, 6th Baron Byron, later George Gordon Noel Byron (1788-1824). Byron was an English poet and a leading figure in the romantic movement of his time. He was handsome, athletic, a competent boxer, horseman and excellent swimmer. He was and is widely read and influential in the English speaking world and beyond. Famous not only for his writings but for his life which featured extravagent living, numerous love affairs including rumours of a scandalous incestuous liaison with his half-sister and self imposed exile.

When Byron's mother-in-law, Judith Noel, died in 1822 her will required that he change his surname to Noel in order to inherit half her estate and so he obtained a Royal Warrant to do so. This Royal Warrant also allowed him to suscribe the said surname of Noel before all titles of honour' and from that point he signed himself as Noel Byron. There was some speculation that he did this so that his initials were NB thus mimicing those of his hero Napoleon Bonaparte.

It is significant that in the part letter offered here, Byron mentions that 'though not yet decided that circumstances may conduct me once more to Greece' because within six weeks he left Genoa for Greece to support it in its efforts to gain independence from the Ottoman Empire. While in Greece Byron fell ill on 24 February 1824 and despite a partial recovery in early April he became ill again and it is thought that as a result of poor medical treatment he finally died on 19 April 1824 in Missolonghi.

Since Byron only started signing his name as Noel Byron sometime in 1822 then this style of signature was only used for a relatively short period of about two years and hence must be considered extremely scarce.



In Ireland and Scotland, the measures taken by him against Catholics is likened by historians as being near-genocidal. Cromwell was detested by the Royalists so much that when they returned to power they had his corpse dug up, hung in chains and beheaded.

Charles Francois Le Brun (1739-1824) was a French statesman and twice arrested during the Reign of Terror in 1793 and again in 1794.


